Mid-Continent Fractionation and Storage, LLC – Conway Fractionator has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300. **K.A.R. 115-2-1.** The regulation makes changes in the fees for various licenses and permits.

#### **Economic Impact Summary**

No anticipated enhancement or restriction of business activities is expected due to the fee increases. The estimated revenue production is based on the current levels of sales for each category and no reduction in sales or demand is anticipated. Consequently, no impact is anticipated on any specific businesses, sectors, public utility ratepayers, or local governments. Individuals purchasing the involved licenses will bear the cost involved and the Kansas economy will be impacted positively by a total of \$3,740,500.00. Historically, license and fee permit increases have not resulted in a reduction in the number of permits sold. The demand for Kansas hunting and fishing licenses is expected to continue based upon the comparable fees charged by other states and the quality of hunting and fishing experiences that Kansas offers. The increased fees will be utilized by KDWP to address operational cost increases and allow the agency to continue to provide recreational opportunities and maintain Kansas wildlife and habitat, despite revenue shortfalls due to inflation. The only known costs will be born by individual license/permit purchases.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE), Division of Public Health, Bureau of Facilities and Licensing, will conduct a public hearing at 10:00 a.m. Tuesday, November 14, 2023, in Room 530, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 SW Jackson, Topeka, Kansas, to consider the adoption of proposed new KDHE Article 34 permanent regulations 28-34-145, 28-34-146, 28-34-147, 28-34-148, 28-34-149, 28-34-150, 28-34-151, and 28-34-152 regarding rural emergency hospitals. These regulations are being proposed as temporary regulations and as permanent regulations.

A summary of the proposed regulations and estimated economic impact follows:

#### **Summary of Regulations**

**K.A.R. 28-34-145. Definitions.** Defines the meaning of terms as used in K.A.R. 28-34-145 through 28-34-152.

**K.A.R. 28-34-146. Application process.** Requires any person wanting to operate a rural emergency hospital to meet the eligibility requirements of K.S.A. 65-484 and to

file an application on a licensing agency form at least 90 days before admission of patients; specifies the information each applicant for a rural emergency hospital shall submit to the licensing agency during the application process; provides that the secretary may deny granting of a license to any applicant if the applicant is not in compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

**K.A.R. 28-34-147. Licensing procedure; renewals.** Specifies the timeframe, application form requirements, and provisions for licensing and licensing renewals; requires that new construction, alterations, or renovations for patient services or patient rooms shall not be used until authorized by the licensing agency; requires a rural emergency hospital found to be non-compliant to submit a plan of correction with specific corrective actions before a license is issued or renewed; outlines accrediting survey requirements; specifies the ways the licensing agency verifies rural emergency hospital compliance with requirements specified in K.A.R. 28-34-146 through 28-34-152; provides for multiple licensure type situations.

**K.A.R. 28-34-148. Terms of a license; amendments.** Specifies the terms of a rural emergency hospital license, including effective period, physical location, and issuance and invalidity of new, amended, or renewed licenses; sets forth the criteria under which a licensee shall submit a request to the licensing agency for an amended license; specifies that a licensee of a rural emergency hospital who also holds a license for a general hospital or critical access hospital shall ensure that an amended rural emergency hospital license does not affect the license for a general hospital or a critical hospital.

**K.A.R. 28-34-149. Rural emergency hospital services.** Requires that each rural emergency hospital provide only services pursuant to K.S.A. 65-483, and amendments thereto.

**K.A.R. 28-34-150. Conditions of participation.** Adopts by reference specified sections, deletes specified sections, and replaces specified text in 42 C.F.R., part 485, effective January 1, 2023, regarding conditions of participation as a rural emergency hospital.

**K.A.R. 28-34-151. Construction standards.** Requires that rural emergency hospital construction of new buildings and additions or alterations to existing buildings be in accordance with K.A.R. 28-34-32b.

**K.A.R. 28-34-152. Laboratory services.** Specifies that a rural emergency hospital provide laboratory services in accordance with K.A.R. 28-34-11.

#### **Economic Impact**

**Cost to the agency:** The proposed regulations may result in minimal increased paperwork costs that can be absorbed in the current agency budget.

**Cost to the public and regulated community:** Each hospital will have to conduct a cost-benefit analysis to determine the costs of restructuring their current facility from a Critical Access Hospital to comply with Rural Emergency Hospital licensure requirements. Therefore, it would be difficult for the agency to quantify costs to hospitals seeking to become a Rural Emergency Hospital. Because of the difficulty in quantifying costs to hos-

pitals, the agency cannot quantify the costs to affected businesses or members of the public.

Costs to other governmental agencies or units: Because of the difficulty in quantifying costs to hospitals, the agency could not quantify costs to local governments. There are no costs related to the proposed regulations that are reasonably expected to be incurred by any other governmental agencies or units.

A detailed economic impact is provided in the economic impact statement that is available from the designated KDHE contact staff person or at the Bureau of Facilities and Licensing website, as listed below.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a 60-day public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. Interested parties are encouraged to participate in the public hearing by submitting written comments.

During the hearing, all interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed regulations as well as an opportunity to submit their written comments. It is requested that each individual giving oral comments also provide a written copy of the comments for the record. In order to give each individual an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary for the hearing officer to request that each presenter limit an oral presentation to an appropriate time frame.

regulations: K.A.R. 7-43-7; K.A.R. 7-43-8; K.A.R. 7-43-12; K.A.R. 7-43-13; K.A.R. 7-43-14; K.A.R. 7-43-15; K.A.R. 7-43-17; K.A.R. 7-43-18; K.A.R. 7-43-19; K.A.R. 7-43-20; K.A.R. 7-43-22.

The Revised Uniform Law on Notarial Acts, K.S.A. 53-5a01, *et seq.*, took effect on January 1, 2022. An initial set of regulations was adopted soon thereafter. The legal staff of the National Notary Association reviewed the permanent regulations adopted in 2022 and recommended several specific wording changes to 12 regulations. These changes are essentially fine-tuning of the regulations to ensure clarity.

Adopting these regulations imposes no economic burdens on any level of government or on notaries public and imposes no environmental impact.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. **Notice of Right to Request a Hearing Regarding the  
Proposed Revocation of Administrative Regulations**

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-440, the Kansas Department of Revenue, Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control (“ABC”) submitted a report to the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules and Regulations (“JCARR”) summarizing ABC’s review of its administrative regulations and identifying regulations that are not necessary for the implementation and administration of state law. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-426(d), the Department of Revenue proposes to revoke 31 of the regulations identified in that re-

port by filing a notice of revocation with the Secretary of State. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-426(d)(2)(A), the Department will schedule a public hearing on the proposed notice of revocation only upon the written request of a member of the public. This Notice of Right to Request a Hearing serves as at least 30 days' notice of the right to make that written request.

The following regulations are proposed for revocation because they duplicate existing statute, do not reflect current industry practices, or are inconsistent with statute.

- **K.A.R. 14-5-1.** Alcoholic liquor (except beer) transported into state or federal area only by bonded carriers.
- **K.A.R. 14-5-2.** Carriers' permits; application; fees.
- **K.A.R. 14-5-4.** Storage of alcoholic liquor and cereal malt beverage in transit in public liquor warehouses; reports of warehouseman.
- **K.A.R. 14-5-6.** Required delivery of alcoholic liquor to distributor by common carrier.
- **K.A.R. 14-7-6.** Kansas liquor stamps or strips; securing, affixation to original package; who shall affix; placing of stamps or strips.
- **K.A.R. 14-11-16.** Farm wineries and farm winery outlets selling at retail; marking prices; price or inventory control tags; shelf markings.
- **K.A.R. 14-16-17.** Hearing procedures; prehearing motions.
- **K.A.R. 14-16-18.** Prehearing conference; availability; notice.
- **K.A.R. 14-16-19.** Hearing procedures.
- **K.A.R. 14-17-5.** Acceptance of hospitality by director and employees.
- **K.A.R. 14-19-4a.** Liquor pool; storage.
- **K.A.R. 14-19-19.** Change of club status.
- **K.A.R. 14-19-31.** Clubs charge the same price for the same drink all day; day defined.
- **K.A.R. 14-19-33.** Federal retail stamp.
- **K.A.R. 14-19-37.** Display of license.

- **K.A.R. 14-20-33.** Clubs charge the same price for the same drink all day; day defined.
- **K.A.R. 14-20-35.** Federal retail stamp.
- **K.A.R. 14-20-39.** Display of license.
- **K.A.R. 14-21-16.** Drinking establishments charge the same price for the same drink all day; day defined.
- **K.A.R. 14-21-18.** Federal retail stamp.
- **K.A.R. 14-22-17.** Caterers charge the same price for the same drink all day; day defined.
- **K.A.R. 14-22-18.** Federal retail stamp.
- **K.A.R. 14-23-2.** Applications; documents required.
- **K.A.R. 14-23-4.** Issuance of permit.
- **K.A.R. 14-23-6.** Refund upon voluntary cancellation.
- **K.A.R. 14-23-7.** Employees; prohibitions.
- **K.A.R. 14-23-8.** Purchase of alcoholic liquor; requirements and restrictions.
- **K.A.R. 14-23-9.** Permit holder's responsibility for conduct at event.
- **K.A.R. 14-23-10.** Removal of liquor from event premises prohibited; boundary requirement.
- **K.A.R. 14-23-11.** Nontaxed liquor; individual bringing alcoholic liquor on to permitted premises.
- **K.A.R. 14-23-13.** Charge the same price for the same drink all day; day defined.
