KANSAS EXPANDED LOTTERY RULES AND REGULATIONS

Article 306.—SPECIFIC LOTTERY FACILITY GAMES AT LOTTERY GAMING FACILITIES; PAI-GOW POKER FORTUNE BONUS

111-306-1. Name of the game; rules and regulations. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a lottery facility game at the Boot Hill Casino & Resort in Dodge City, Kansas, entitled "Pai-Gow Poker Fortune Bonus" beginning on or after June 1, 2010.

The rules and regulations for the game of "Pai-Gow Poker Fortune Bonus" are contained in K.A.R. 111-306-1 through 111-306-6, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-201-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-18-10, May 19, 2010.)

111-306-2. Object of game. The "Pai-Gow Poker Fortune Bonus" is played with one deck of 53 cards, the back of which cards shall all be identical in appearance.

Each deck of playing cards shall consist of 13 value cards (ace, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, jack, queen, and king) in each of four suits (hearts, spades, diamonds, and clubs), plus one joker. The object of the game is for a player to beat the dealer's hand by creating a high hand (five cards) and a low hand (two cards) that are higher in value than the dealer's hand. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-18-10, May 19, 2010.)

111-306-3. Definitions. The following definitions, when used in the Southwest Kansas Lottery Gaming Zone, when pertaining to the game of "Pai-Gow Poker Fortune Bonus" shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

(a) "Bank" or "banker" shall mean the house or the dealer.

(b) "Bonus wager" shall mean an optional wager that the player's seven cards will form a qualifying poker hand, regardless of the manner in which the player set the high hand and the low hand. All bonus wagers shall be banked by the house.

(c) "Copy hand" shall mean either a two-card hand or a five-card hand of a player which is identical in rank to the corresponding two-card hand or five-card hand of the dealer.

(d) "Envy bonus" shall mean an additional fixed sum payoff made to a player who placed a bonus wager of at least \$5.00 when another player at the pai-gow poker table is the holder of a premium qualifying poker hand. A player is entitled to multiple envy bonuses if more than one other player is the holder of a premium qualifying poker hand; provided, however, that a player is not entitled to an envy bonus for his or her own cards or the cards of the dealer.

(e) "High hand" shall mean the five-card hand which is formed from the seven cards dealt at the game of pai-gow poker so as to rank equal to or higher than the two-card low hand.

(f) "Natural" when referring to a hand in pai-gow poker shall mean a hand that does not utilize a joker.

(g) "Owner" shall mean the first person betting in a position, the seated player.

(h) "Premium qualifying poker hand" shall mean a five-card or seven-card poker hand with a rank of four-of-a-kind or higher formed from the seven cards dealt to a player.

(i) "Push" shall mean a player loses or has a copy hand on either the high hand or low hand, but wins on the remaining hand.

(j) "Qualifying poker hand" shall mean a five-card or seven-card poker hand with a rank of three-of-a-kind or higher formed from the seven cards dealt to a player.

(k) "Rank" or "ranking" shall mean the relative position of a card or group of cards.

(l) "Second highest" or "low hand" shall mean the two-card hand which is formed from the seven cards dealt at the game of pai-gow poker so as to rank equal to or lower than the five-card high hand.

(m) "Set" or "setting the hands" shall mean the process of forming a high hand and low hand from the seven cards dealt.

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(n) "Shadow" or "shadow wager" shall mean a wager another player is allowed to place behind the owner's bet. A shadow bet must abide by table minimums and maximums. The owner has complete jurisdiction over the decisions made when the cards are dealt. The shadow wager must never be stacked on top of the owner's wager.

(o) "Suit" shall mean one of the four categories of cards, i.e., diamond, spade, club, or heart. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-18-10, May 19, 2010.)

111-306-4. Hand rankings. (a) The ranking of the cards used in pai-gow poker, in order of highest to lowest rank, is ace, king, queen, jack, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, and 2. An ace may be used to complete a "straight flush" or a "straight" formed with a 2, 3, 4, and 5. Except as otherwise provided below, the joker is used and ranked as an ace.

(1) Five aces - a high hand consisting of the four "natural aces" in the deck with the joker played in the five-card hand.

(2) Royal flush - a high hand consisting of an ace, king, queen, jack, and 10 of the same suite with or without the joker in the five-card hand.

(3) Straight flush - a high hand consisting of five cards of the same suite in consecutive ranking with ace, 2, 3, 4, and 5 being the highest ranking and 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 being the lowest.

(4) Four of a kind - a high hand consisting of four cards of the same rank with four aces being the highest and four 2's being the lowest.

(5) Full house - a high hand consisting of three-of-a-kind and a pair, with three aces with two kings being the highest and three 2's with two 3's being the lowest.

(6) Flush - a high hand consisting of five cards of the same suit.

(7) Straight - a high hand consisting of five cards of consecutive rank regardless of suit, with the rankings as follows:

(i) Ace, queen, jack, 10 is the highest ranking straight.

(ii) Ace, 2, 3, 4, 5, is the second ranking straight.

(iii) All other straight rankings will be determined by the highest card in the straight.

(8) Three-of-a-kind - a high hand consisting of three cards of the same rank regardless of suit.

(9) Two pair - a high hand consisting of two pairs of two cards of the same rank regardless of suit.

(10) One pair - a high hand consisting of two cards of the same rank regardless of suit.

(11) High card - a hand that does not encompass any of the hands above.

For purposes of setting the hands, a joker may be used as any card to complete a straight, a flush, a straight flush, or a royal flush.

(b) The following hand rankings are only applicable to pai-gow poker bonus wagers:

(1) Seven-card natural straight flush - a hand consisting of all seven of the player's cards in the same suit in consecutive ranking using no joker.

(2) Royal flush plus royal match - a high hand consisting of an ace, king, queen, jack, and 10 of the same suit

in the five-card hand and a king and queen of the same suite in the two-card hand.

(3) Seven-card straight flush utilizing a joker - same as subsection (b)(1) above, except using the joker as one of the seven cards. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-18-10, May 19, 2010.)

111-306-5. Wagers. (a) Only players who are seated at the pai-gow poker table may touch his or her own cards. Once a player has placed a wager and received cards, that player must remain seated until the completion of the round of play. Once the player sets the player's hands, the player may not touch the cards again.

(b) Shadow betting may be allowed at the discretion of the lottery gaming facility manager and approval of the Kansas lottery.

(c) All wagers at pai-gow poker shall be placed prior to the dealer announcing, "No more bets." No wager at pai-gow poker shall be made, increased, or withdrawn after the dealer has announced, "No more bets."

(d) Prior to the first card being dealt for each round of play, each player at the game of pai-gow poker fortune bonus shall make a pai-gow poker wager against the dealer. There is also an optional bonus bet wager that, if placed, must be placed prior to the first card being dealt for each round to be active.

(1) The pai-gow poker wager shall win if the high hand of the player is higher in rank than the high hand of the dealer and the low hand of the player is higher in rank than the low hand of the dealer.

(2) If the optional bonus wager is placed, the bonus wager shall win if the player's seven cards will form a qualifying poker hand, regardless of the manner in which the player set the high hand and the low hand.

(3) If the player has placed an optional bonus wager of \$5 (five dollars) or more, the envy wager shall win when another player at the pai-gow poker table is the holder of a premium qualifying poker hand.

(e) A pai-gow poker wager made by a player is a push if:

(1) The high hand of the player is higher in rank than the high hand of the dealer, but the low hand of the player is identical in rank to the low hand of the dealer (copy hand) or lower in rank than the low hand of the dealer, or

(2) The high hand of the player is identical in rank to the high hand of the dealer (copy hand) or lower in rank than the high hand of the dealer, but the low hand of the player is higher in rank than the low hand of the dealer.

(f) After each round of play is complete, the dealer shall collect all losing wagers and pay off all winning wagers with the exception of any hands that are subject to income tax withholding and/or reporting, which are paid once the necessary documents are completed. All winning pai-gow poker wagers made in accordance with these rules shall be paid at odds of one to one.

(g) A winning pai-gow poker wager shall be paid off by a lottery gaming facility manager at odds of one to one, except that the lottery gaming facility manager shall extract a commission known as "vigorish" from the winning player in an amount equal to five percent of the

amount won, provided, however, that when collecting the vigorish, the lottery gaming facility manager may round off the vigorish to the nearest half dollar. If a player leaves the table, but owes a vigorish of twenty-five cents or less, the casino will waive the vigorish. The vigorish will be collected from a player at the time the winning payout is made, unless the vigorish is less than a fifty-cent increment, in which event the dealer will place a lammer or marker on the player's spot to indicate the running total of the vigorish. At the time that the vigorish reaches at least fifty-cents, it will be paid.

(h) Any player who has made a pai-gow poker wager may, at the same time, make a pai-gow bonus wager by placing gaming chips in the area designed for a bonus wager at his or her betting position. A bonus wager shall be no less than \$1.00.

(i) Any player who makes a bonus wager of \$5.00 or more shall qualify to receive an envy bonus payment. The dealer shall place an envy bonus marker immediately in front any bonus wager of \$5.00 or more.

(j) If a pai-gow bonus wager has been made by one or more players, the dealer shall observe the following procedures:

(1) The cards of any player who has placed a bonus wager shall remain on the layout regardless of the outcome of his or her pai-gow poker wager until removed in accordance with the provisions of (k)(2) or (k)(3) below, and

(2) If any player has placed a bonus wager of \$5.00 or more, the cards of each player shall remain on the layout regardless of the outcome of his or her pai-gow poker wager until removed in accordance with the provisions below.

(k) After settling the pai-gow poker wager of a player who has placed a bonus wager, the dealer shall rearrange the seven cards of the player to form the best possible hand and shall be ultimately responsible for creating such hand for purposes of the bonus wager. A joker may be used as any card to complete any straight, flush, straight flush or royal flush or other than a seven-card straight flush with no joker. If any player at the table has placed a bonus wager of \$5.00 or more, the dealer shall rearrange the cards of each player at the table regardless of whether that player has placed a bonus wager, and then proceed as follows:

(1) If the player does not have a qualifying pai-gow poker hand, the dealer shall collect the bonus wager, if applicable, and place the cards of the player in the discard rack.

(2) If the player has a qualifying pai-gow poker hand, the dealer shall, if applicable, pay the winning bonus wager in accordance with the approved pay table and place the cards of the player in the discard rack.

(3) If the player has a premium qualifying poker hand, the dealer shall verbally acknowledge the premium qualifying poker hand and leave the bonus wager, if applicable, and the cards of the player face up on the table.

(l) After all other bonus wagers have been settled, the dealer shall, starting from the right and moving clockwise around the table, settle with each player who has an envy bonus marker at his or her betting position or who has a bonus wager and a premium qualifying poker hand.

(1) If the player has an envy bonus marker, the dealer shall pay the player the appropriate envy bonus payment set forth by these rules and collect the envy bonus marker and place the cards of the player in the discard rack.

(2) If the player has a bonus wager and a premium qualifying poker hand, the dealer shall pay the winning bonus wager in accordance with the approved pay table and place the cards of the player in the discard rack.

(3) After all envy bonuses and premium qualifying poker hands are paid, the dealer shall collect the cards of any player who had a premium qualifying poker hand but did not place a bonus wager and place the cards of the player in the discard rack.

(m) All winning bonus and envy wagers made in accordance with these rules shall be paid at the following odds or in the following amounts, as applicable:

(n) Notwithstanding the payout odds set forth in (m) above, the aggregate payout limit on all winning bonus wagers for any hand shall be \$25,000 or the maximum amount that one patron could win per round when betting the minimum wager, whichever is greater. The aggregate payout information shall be displayed at the pai-gow poker table. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-18-10, May 19, 2010.)

111-306-6. Play. (a) The starting position for the dealing of cards or the delivery of stacks of cards for the game of pai-gow poker may be determined in one of the following manners:

(1) The dealer shall shake the pai-gow poker shaker and dice at least three times so as to cause a random mixture of the dice.

(A) The dealer shall then remove the lid covering the pai-gow poker shaker, total the dice and announce the total.

(B) To determine the starting position, the dealer shall count counterclockwise around the table, with the position of the dealer considered number one, and continuing around the table with each betting position counted in order, including the dealer, regardless of whether there is a wager at the position, until the count matches the total of the three dice.

(C) The dealer shall place the cover on the pai-gow poker shaker and shake the shaker once. The pai-gow poker shaker shall then be placed to the left of the dealer's rack.

(2) The dealer may use a computerized random number generator to select and display a number from 1

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through 7, inclusive, and verbally announce the number. To determine the starting position, the dealer shall count counterclockwise around the table, with the position of the dealer considered number one, and continuing around the table with each betting position counted in order, including the dealer, regardless of whether there is a wager at the position, until the count matches the number displayed by the random number generator.

(b) After all players have set their hands and placed the cards on the table, the seven cards of the dealer shall be turned over and the dealer shall set his or her hands by arranging the cards into a high and low hand using the following rules:

(1) No pair - use the highest card in the high hand. Use the second and third highest cards in the low hand.

(2) One pair - always play the pair in the high hand.

(3) Two pair - always split unless one or both pair are five and under and the dealer has an ace, king, queen, or jack. Split of both pair are six or above.

(4) Three pair - always play the highest pair in the low hand.

(5) Three-of-a-kind - always play the three-of-a-kind in the high hand and play the next two highest cards in the low hand, except that if the three-of-a-kind is aces, play a pair of aces in the high hand and an ace and the next highest card in the low hand, and if the dealer has two three-of-a-kinds, the dealer must break the higher three-of-a-kind and use it as a pair for the low hand keeping the lower three-of-a-kind in the high hand.

(6) Straights - six and seven card straights always play the highest two cards possible for the low hand while still playing a straight in the high hand, except that if two pair is with the straight, always apply the two pair rule, and if the dealer holds a straight with a flush at the same time, the dealer must always play the highest possible low hand. The ace, 2, 3, 4, and 5 are the second highest straight.

(7) Flush, including straight flush and royal flush - for six and seven card flushes (and straight flushes) the dealer must play the highest two cards possible in the low hand while still playing the flush in the high hand, except that if two pair is with the flush (or straight flush), the two pair rule will apply, and if the dealer holds a flush with a straight at the same time, the dealer must always play the highest possible low hand.

(8) Full house - always play the pair in the low hand and the three-of-a-kind in the high hand, except that if the dealer holds a full house with another pair, the dealer must play the highest pair in the low hand and the full house in the high hand.

(9) Four-of-a-kind - apply the two pair rule, except that if one pair of three-of-a-kind is with the four-of-a-kind is aces and the pair or three-of-a-kind is kings, then play the kings in the low hand the four aces in the high hand.

(10) Five aces - always play a pair of aces in the low hand and the three aces in the high hand, except that if the dealer holds a pair of kings with five aces, the dealer must play the pair of kings in the low hand and the five aces in the high hand.

(c) The dealer shall then place the two hands face up on the appropriate area of the layout.

(d) A player may not surrender his or her hand.

(e) Once the dealer has set a high hand and a low hand, the dealer shall expose both hands of each player, starting from the right and proceeding counterclockwise around the table. The dealer shall compare the high and low hand of each player to the high and low hand of the dealer and shall announce if the pai-gow poker wager of that player shall win, lose, or be considered a tie.

(f) All losing wagers shall be immediately collected by the dealer and put in the table games chip tray. A pai-gow poker wager made by a player shall lose if:

(1) The high hand of the player is lower in rank than the high hand of the dealer and the low hand of the player is lower in rank than the low hand of the dealer;

(2) The high hand of the player is identical in rank to the high hand of the dealer or the low hand of the player is identical in rank to the low hand of the dealer (a copy hand) and the other hand of the player is identical in rank or lower in rank than the other hand of the dealer;

(3) The high hand of the player was not set so as to rank equal to or higher than the low hand of that player; or

(4) The two hands of the player were not otherwise set correctly in accordance with the rules of the game (for example, a player forms a three-card low hand and a four-card high hand).

(g) All hands that resulted in a winning pai-gow poker wager shall remain face up on the layout. Winning wagers shall be paid as the dealer exposes the players' cards with the exception of the hands that require income tax withholding and/or reporting, which are paid once the necessary documents are completed.

(h) After a winning pai-gow poker wager has been paid and the vigorish collected, the dealer shall then, if applicable, pay the winning bonus wager of that player. Before paying a winning bonus wager, the dealer shall, if necessary, reset the player's high hand and low hand to form the hand type yielding the highest bonus payout to which the player is entitled. The dealer shall then collect the cards from that player.

(i) All cards collected by the dealer shall be picked up in order and placed in the discard rack in such a way that they can be readily arranged to reconstruct each hand in case of a question or dispute.

(j) The following irregularities or invalid roll of dice shall apply:

(1) If the dealer uncovers the pai-gow poker shaker and all three dice do not land flat on the bottom of the shaker, the dealer shall call a "No roll" and reshake the dice.

(2) If the dealer uncovers the pai-gow poker shaker and a die or dice fall out of the shaker, the dealer shall call a "No roll" and reshake the dice.

(3) If the dealer incorrectly totals the dice and deals the first card or delivers the first stack to the wrong position, all hands shall be called dead and the dealer shall reshuffle the cards.

(4) If the dealer exposes any of the cards dealt to a player, the player has the option of voiding the hand. Without looking at the unexposed cards, the player shall make the decision either to play out the hand or to void the hand.

(5) If a card or cards in the hand of the dealer or bank is (are) exposed, all hands shall be void and the cards shall be reshuffled.

(6) A card found turned face up in the shoe shall not be used in the game and shall be placed in the discard rack. If more than one card is found turned face up in the shoe, all hands shall be void and the cards shall be re-shuffled.

(7) A card drawn in error without its face being exposed shall be used as though it was the next card from the shoe.

(8) If any player or the dealer is dealt an incorrect number of cards, all hands shall be void and the cards re-shuffled.

(9) If the dealer does not set his or her hands in the manner specified above, the hands must be reset in accordance with this submission and the round of play completed.

(10) If an automated card shuffling device is being used and the device jams, stop shuffling during a shuffle, or fails to complete a shuffle cycle, the cards shall be re-shuffled.

(11) If an automated dealing she is being used and the device jams, stops dealing cards, or fails to deal all cards during a round of play, the round of play shall be void, and the cards shall be removed from the device and re-shuffled with any cards already dealt.

(12) If cards become soiled in the course of play and the dealer finds that a card is unsuitable for use, a table games floor supervisor will bring a substitute card from the card reserve in the pit stand and the unsuitable card is placed in a sealed envelope or container. The table games floor supervisor will maintain the envelope in a secure place within the pit until collection by security personnel. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-18-10, May 19, 2010.)

Article 307.—SPECIFIC LOTTERY FACILITY GAMES AT LOTTERY GAMING FACILITIES; ULTIMATE TEXAS HOLD'EM POKER

111-307-1. Name of the game; rules and regulations. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a lottery facility game at the Boot Hill Casino & Resort in Dodge City, Kansas, entitled "Ultimate Texas Hold'em Poker" beginning on or after June 1, 2010.

The rules and regulations for the game of "Ultimate Texas Hold'em Poker" are contained in K.A.R. 111-307-1 through 111-307-7, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-201-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-18-10, May 19, 2010.)

111-307-2. Object of game. Ultimate Texas Hold'em Poker is a poker-based game between the player and the dealer, in which one or more players have multiple wager options. Players are dealt two cards and use the five community cards to make the highest ranking poker hand possible. Ultimate Texas Hold'em is played with one deck of 52 cards, the back of which cards shall all be identical in appearance. Each deck of playing cards shall consist of 13 value cards (ace, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, jack, queen, and king) in each of four suits (hearts, spades, diamonds, and clubs). (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp.

74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-18-10, May 19, 2010.)

111-307-3. Definitions. The following words and terms, when used in the Southwest Kansas Lottery Gaming Zone and pertaining to the game of Ultimate Texas Hold'em Poker, shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

(a) "Ante" or "ante wager" means an initial wager, separate from but equal in amount to the player's blind wager, required to be made prior to any cards being dealt in order to participate in the round of play.

(b) "Blind" or "blind wager" means an initial wager, separate from but equal in amount to the player's ante, required to be made prior to any cards being dealt in order to participate in the round of play.

(c) "Burn" means to remove the top or next card from the deck and place it face down in the discard rack without revealing it to anyone.

(d) "Check" means that the player waives the right to place a play wager but remains in the round of play.

(e) "Community card" means any of the five cards dealt face up in the center of the table, all of which may be used by each player and the dealer together with his or her own two cards to form the best possible five-card poker hand.

(f) "Flop" means the first three community cards dealt face up in the area designated for the placement of the community cards.

(g) "Fold" means the withdrawal of a player from a round of play by discarding his or her two cards and not making a play wager.

(h) "Hand" or "poker hand" means the highest ranking five-card hand that can be formed from the five community cards and the two cards dealt to the dealer or a player.

(i) "Play wager" means a wager made after two cards have been dealt to each player and the dealer, which wager can be made before the flop is dealt, after the flop is dealt but before the final two community cards are dealt, or after the final two community cards are dealt but before the dealer reveals his or her two cards.

(j) "Push" means a tie or draw, and occurs if the player's five-card hand and the dealer's five-card hand are of equal rank. In a push, the dealer shall not take or pay the player's ante, blind, or play wagers.

(k) "Rank" or "ranking" means the relative position of a card or group of cards as set forth in K.A.R. 111-307-4, "Ultimate Texas Hold'em hand rankings."

(l) "Round of play" or "round" means one complete cycle of play during which all players playing at the table have been dealt a hand, have folded or wagered upon it, and have had their wagers paid or collected.

(m) "Stub" means the remaining portion of the deck after all cards in the round of play have been dealt.

(n) "Suit" means one of the four categories of cards: club, diamond, heart, or spade, with no suit being higher in rank than another.

(o) "Trips wager" means an optional wager that a player may make prior to any cards being dealt that the player's best five-card hand will be a three-of-a-kind or

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better, with a winning trips wager being paid in accordance with a posted pay table regardless of the outcome of the player's hand against the dealer's hand. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-18-10, May 19, 2010.)

111-307-4. Ultimate Texas Hold'em hand rankings. (a) The rank of the cards used in Ultimate Texas Hold'em, for the determination of winning hands, in order of highest to lowest rank, shall be: ace, king, queen, jack, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, and 2. All suits shall be considered equal in rank. Notwithstanding the foregoing, an ace may be used to complete a "straight flush" or a "straight" formed with a 2, 3, 4, and 5.

(b) The permissible poker hands at the game of Ultimate Texas Hold'em, in order of highest to lowest rank, shall be:

(1) "Royal flush" is a hand consisting of an ace, king, queen, jack, and 10 of the same suit;

(2) "Straight flush" is a hand consisting of five cards of the same suit in consecutive ranking, with ace, king, queen, jack, and 10 being the highest ranking five-card straight flush and ace, 2, 3, 4, and 5 being the lowest ranking five-card straight flush;

(3) "Four-of-a-kind" is a hand consisting of four cards of the same rank regardless of suit, with four aces being the highest ranking four-of-a-kind and four 2s being the lowest ranking four-of-a-kind;

(4) "Full house" is a hand consisting of "three-of-a-kind" and a "pair," with the three aces and two kings being the highest ranking full house and three 2s, two 3s being the lowest ranking full house;

(5) "Flush" is a hand consisting of five cards of the same suit, not in consecutive order, with ace, king, queen, jack, and 9 being the highest ranking flush and 2, 3, 4, 5, and 7 being the lowest flush;

(6) "Straight" is a hand consisting of five unsuited cards of consecutive rank, with an ace, king, queen, jack, and 10 being the highest ranking straight and an ace, 2, 3, 4, and 5 being the lowest ranking straight, provided that an ace may not be combined with any other sequence of cards for purposes of determining a winning hand, (for example, queen, king, ace, 2, 3);

(7) "Three-of-a-kind" is a hand consisting of three cards of the same rank, with three aces being the highest ranking three-of-a-kind and three 2s being the lowest ranking three-of-a-kind;

(8) "Two pairs" is a hand consisting of two "pairs," with two aces and two kings being the highest ranking two pair and two 3s and two 2s being the lowest ranking two pair; and

(9) "One pair" is a hand consisting of two cards of the same rank, with two aces being the highest ranking pair and two 2s being the lowest ranking pair;

(c) When comparing two hands which are of identical poker rank as described herein as "permissible poker hands," or which contain none of the hands authorized in this section, the hand that contains the highest ranking card as provided in (a) above which is not contained in the other hand shall be considered the higher ranking hand. If the hands are of identical rank after the appli-

cation of this section, the hands shall be considered a push. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-18-10, May 19, 2010.)

111-307-5. Wagers. (a) All wagers at Ultimate Texas Hold'em shall be made by placing gaming chips or, if applicable, a match play coupon on the appropriate abetting areas of the table layout. A verbal wager accompanied by cash shall not be accepted.

(b) All ante, blind, and trips wagers shall be placed prior to the dealer dealing the hand. Except for a "play wager" as provided in K.A.R. 111-307-6, "play," no wager shall be made, increased, or withdrawn after the dealer begins to deal the hand.

(c) Upon placing an ante wager and a blind wager, a player may also place a trips wager by placing a wager on the designated betting area of the layout. The outcome of the trips wager shall have no bearing on any other wager made by the player at the game of Ultimate Texas Hold'em.

(d) Play wagers shall be made in accordance with the provisions et forth in these rules.

(e) Only players who are seated at the Ultimate Texas Hold'em poker table may place a wager at the game. Once a player has placed a wager and received cards, that player must remain seated until the completion of the round of play.

(f) A player shall not be permitted to wager on more than one player position at an Ultimate Texas Hold'em table. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-18-10, May 19, 2010.)

111-307-6. Play. (a) For the start of play, the dealer shall, starting with the player farthest to his or her left and continuing around the table in a clockwise manner, deal the cards as follows:

(1) One card face down to each player who has placed wagers.

(2) One card face down to the area designated for the dealer's hand under a cover card.

(3) A second card face down to each player who has placed wagers.

(4) A second card face down to an area designated for the dealer's hand under a cover card.

(b) After the dealing procedures specified above have been completed, each player shall examine his or her cards without exposing them to any person and replace the cards face down on the layout. The dealer shall then, starting with the player farthest to his or her left and proceeding in a clockwise manner around the table, ask each player if the player wishes to place a play wager prior to the dealing of the first three community cards. The player may either check or place a play wager in an amount equal to three or four times the amount of the player's ante wager.

(c) If a player places a play wager, the wager shall be placed in the designated play betting area.

(d) If a player checks, the player shall remain in the game and defer his or her decision to place a play wager to the next betting opportunity.

(e) Once all players have either placed a play wager or checked, the dealer shall burn the next card. The dealer shall then deal the next three cards in the deck (the flop) face up to the designated area for the community cards.

(f) After the flop has been dealt, the dealer shall, starting with the player farthest to his or her left and proceeding in a clockwise manner around the table, ask each player who has not placed a play wager if he or she wishes to place a play wager prior to the dealing of the final two community cards. The player may either check or place a play wager in an amount equal to two times the amount of the player's ante wager.

(g) If a player places a play wager, the wager shall be placed in the designated play betting area.

(h) If a player checks, the player shall remain in the game and defer his or her decision to place a play wager to the next betting opportunity.

(i) Once all players have either placed a play wager or checked, the dealer shall burn the next card. The dealer shall then deal the next two cards in the deck face up to the designated area for the community cards.

(j) After the final two community cards have been dealt, the dealer shall, starting with the player farthest to his or her left and proceeding in a clockwise manner around the table, ask each player who has not yet placed a play wager whether he or she wishes to fold his or her hand or place a play wager equal in amount to his or her ante wager.

(k) If a player places a play wager, the wager shall be placed in the designated play betting area.

(l) If a player folds, the ante and blind wagers of the player shall be collected by the dealer and placed in the table inventory container.

(m) If the player has also placed a trips wager, the dealer shall place the cards of the player face down underneath the player's trips wager pending its resolution at the conclusion of the round of play.

(n) If the player has not placed a trips wager, the dealer shall immediately spread the cards of the folded hand face down and place them in a discard rack.

(o) After each player has either folded or placed a play wager, the dealer shall remove the cover card from the top of the dealer's cards and place it on the table layout. The dealer shall then turn his or her two cards face up, position his or her cards near the three community cards that can be used to form the best possible five-card hand and announce the dealer's hand to the players.

(p) If the dealer's best possible five-card hand is lower than a pair, the dealer shall, starting with the player farthest to the dealer's right who has placed a play wager and proceeding in a counterclockwise manner around the table, return each player's ante wager and resolve all other wagers in accordance with subsection (q) below.

(q) If the dealer's best possible five-card hand is a pair or above, the dealer shall, starting with the player farthest to the dealer's right who has placed a play wager and proceeding in a counterclockwise manner around the table, turn the two cards of each player who has placed a play wager face up and announce the best possible five-card poker hand that can be formed using the player's two cards and the five community cards. The wagers of each player shall be resolved one player at a time regard-

less of outcome. After all wagers placed by a player are settled, the player's cards shall then be immediately collected by the dealer and placed in the discard rack.

(r) If the player's five-card hand is ranked lower than the dealer's five-card hand, the player shall lose and the dealer shall immediately collect any ante, blind and play wagers made by the player and place the wagers in the table inventory container.

(s) If the player's five-card hand is ranked higher than the dealer's five-card hand, the player shall win and the dealer shall pay any ante, blind and play wagers made by the player in accordance with the payout odds set forth below in the section "payment odds;" provided that the blind wager shall not be paid unless the player's winning hand has a rank of straight or higher.

(t) If the player's five-card hand and the dealer's five-card hand are of equal rank, the player's hand shall be a push. In such case, the dealer shall not collect or pay the player's ante, blind, or play wagers.

(u) After settling a player's ante, blind, and play wagers, the dealer shall settle any trips wager made by the player by determining whether the player's five-card hand qualifies for a payout in accordance with K.A.R. 111-307-7. A winning trips wager shall be paid without regard to the outcome of any other wager made by the player. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-18-10, May 19, 2010.)

111-307-7. Payout odds. (a) A lottery gaming facility manager shall pay each winning ante and play wager at odds of 1 to 1.

(b) If a player's five-card hand ranks higher than the dealer's five-card hand, the lottery gaming facility manager shall pay the player's blind wager in accordance with the following odds:

Player's Five-Card Hand	Payout Odds
Royal flush	500 to 1*
Straight flush	50 to 1*
Four-of-a-kind	10 to 1*
Full house	3 to 1*
Flush	3 to 2*
Straight	1 to 1*
Less than a straight	Push

*This does not include the return of the player's original bet.

(c) The lottery gaming facility manager shall pay each winnings trips wager at no less than the odds set forth in the alternative pay table set forth below that is implemented by the lottery gaming facility manager as approved by the executive director of the Kansas lottery:

*The payouts listed above do not include the return of the player's original bet. The trips bets are paid as each hand decision is made.

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(d) The following irregularities shall apply:

(1) If any card dealt to the dealer in Ultimate Texas Hold'em is exposed prior to each player having either folded or placed a play wager, all hands shall be void. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if a player has placed a trips wager, the community cards shall be dealt and each trips wager shall be settled.

(2) A card that is found face up in the shoe or the deck while the cards are being dealt shall not be used in the game and shall be placed in this discard rack. If more than one card is found face up in the shoe or the deck during the dealing of the cards, all hands shall be void and the cards shall be reshuffled. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the card(s) are found face up after each player and the dealer has received his or her initial two cards, the community cards shall be dealt and any trips wager shall be settled in accordance with the payout odds set forth above.

(3) A card drawn in error without its face being exposed shall be used as though it was the next card from the shoe or the deck.

(4) If a player is dealt an incorrect number of cards, that player's hand shall be void. If the dealer is dealt an incorrect number of cards, all players' hands shall be void

unless the dealer can deal himself or herself the correct number of cards in sequence, provided that such cards have not already been turned face up and the deck contains the correct number of cards.

(5) If an automated card shuffling device is being used and the device jams, stops shuffling during a shuffle, or fails to complete a shuffle cycle, the cards shall be reshuffled.

(6) If an automated dealing shoe is being used and the device jams, stops dealing cards, or fails to deal cards during a round of play, the round of play shall be void and the cards shall be removed from the device and reshuffled with any cards already dealt, in accordance with procedures approved by the Kansas lottery commission.

(7) Any automated card shuffling device or automated dealing shoe shall be removed from a gaming table before any other method of shuffling or dealing may be utilized at that table. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-18-10, May 19, 2010.)
