Administrative Regulation

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Tuesday, October 7, in Room 500, Jayhawk Tower, 700 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of a proposed regulation of the State Board of Indigents' Defense Services, K.A.R. 105-11-1, on a permanent basis.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rule and regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Patricia A. Scalia, executive director, State Board of Indigents' Defense Services, 700 S.W. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulation during the hearing.

**K.A.R. 105-11-1** provides for the adoption by reference of the "attorney cost reimbursement tables: assigned counsel and public defender." This table is revised annually and is used by the court to order defendants to pay some or all of the cost of their defense.

This regulation is not mandated by federal law. There is no cost to any state or federal agency created by this regulation. However, this regulation provides the table for an assessment of defense cost against private persons for the professional services of public defenders or assigned counsel. There is no environmental impact.

Amendments to K.A.R. 68-21-7 are proposed for permanent adoption. A summary of the proposed amendments follows:

**K.A.R. 68-21-7. Drugs of concern.** This regulation is amended to update the drugs of concern that are monitored through the Board of Pharmacy's prescription drug monitoring program (KTRACS). The amendment deletes carisoprodol and tramadol and adds prescription pseudoephedrine products and promethazine with codeine.

**Economic Impact.** The adoption of these amendments does not have any additional economic impact to the Board of Pharmacy. In addition, the board does not anticipate that this amendment will have any impact upon other governmental agencies. The board anticipates a nominal impact upon pharmacies that report into the state's prescription drug monitoring program database because they will need to open an additional reporting field in the software database.

The Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services (KDADS), Behavioral Health Services, announces the release of a request for proposals to provide a continuum of crisis services to prevent state hospitalization. Eligible applicants are community mental health centers (CMHCs) and regional recovery centers (RRCs).

Crisis services for behavioral health emergencies have the potential for significant cost savings by reducing inpatient hospitalization and emergency department utilization, and encouraging more appropriate use of community-based behavioral health services. Traditionally, individuals experiencing a behavioral health crisis have been initially treated in a general hospital emergency department or admitted to a hospital and then receive limited outpatient treatment. This approach has been neither cost effective nor consistent with clinical best practice. As a result, several states have developed a continuum of crisis intervention services to provide less expensive, community-based alternatives.

The primary goal of this continuum of services is to support and stabilize an individual, improve psychological symptoms of distress, and engage them earlier in the process of a mental health or a substance use crisis to put important services in place.

After review of any comments received during the public notice period, the secretary of health and environment will issue a determination regarding final agency action on each draft document/application. If response to any draft document/application indicates significant public interest, a public hearing may be held in conformance with K.A.R. 28-16-61 (28-46-21 for UIC).

All draft documents/applications and the supporting information including any comments received are on file and may be inspected at the offices of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Water. **Request for Comments**

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. Midwest Energy, Inc., located at 1330 Canterbury Road, Hays, Kansas, 67601, has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 to install three new spark ignition Wartsila four-stroke lean-burn (4SLB) reciprocating internal combustion engine (RICE) electric generating units using pipeline quality natural gas and auxiliary equipment at its existing Goodman Energy Center facility. Each engine will be nominally rated at 9.4 megawatts (MW) of electricity for a combined power output of approximately 28 MW. The facility also will include a one million British thermal units (MMBtu) per hour gas heater, a 100-horsepower (hp) emergency fire pump, a 250-kW emergency diesel generator, a 200-gallon fuel oil storage tank and a 20-gallon fuel oil storage tank. The facility is located in the Southeast Quarter of Section 7, Township 13 South, Range 18 West, Ellis County, Kansas, approximately 4 miles northwest of Hays, Kansas.

Emissions of particulate matter (PM), PM equal to or less than 10 microns in diameter (PM<sub>10</sub>), PM equal to or less than 2.5 microns in diameter (PM<sub>2.5</sub>), volatile organic compounds (VOCs), oxides of nitrogen (NO<sub>x</sub>), sulfur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>), carbon monoxide (CO), sulfuric acid mist (H<sub>2</sub>SO<sub>4</sub>), hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) and greenhouse gases (GHGs) were evaluated during the permit review process.

The proposed permit is to be issued in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-350, prevention of significant deterioration (PSD), which adopt the federal standards, procedures and requirements of 40 CFR 52.21 by reference. These air quality regulations apply to major stationary emission sources located in areas designated as "attainment" under the federal Clean Air Act (CAA). Attainment areas are areas where the air quality meets or is better than the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS).

The PSD regulations require evaluation of emission reduction techniques to identify the best available control technology (BACT) for each regulated pollutant, including GHGs, for which the emission rate exceeds the PSD significant level. The purpose of BACT is to affect the maximum degree of reduction achievable, taking into account energy, environmental and economic impacts for each regulated pollutant under review. Evaluation of the estimated emissions for the proposed Goodman Energy Center project indicates that the emission rates of PM, PM<sub>10</sub>, PM<sub>2.5</sub> and GHGs all exceed the significance levels. The facility conducted the required BACT analyses. The department has reviewed the BACT analyses for the Goodman Energy Center Project and concurs with its findings as follows:

- For the Wartsila 4SLB RICE, combustion controls and low ash fuels are BACT for PM, PM<sub>10</sub> and PM<sub>2.5</sub>, use

of efficient lean burn engines and use of pipeline quality natural gas fuel, and good combustion practices are BACT for GHGs;

- For the fuel gas heater, good combustion practices are BACT for PM, PM<sub>10</sub> and PM<sub>2.5</sub>, and use of pipeline quality natural gas as fuel, and good combustion practices are BACT for GHGs;
- For the emergency diesel generator, combustion control is BACT for PM, PM<sub>10</sub> and PM<sub>2.5</sub>, and selection of the most efficient engines that meet the project needs is BACT for GHGs;
- For the emergency fire pump, combustion control is BACT for PM, PM<sub>10</sub> and PM<sub>2.5</sub>, and selection of the most efficient engines that meet the project needs is BACT for GHGs.

An ambient impact analysis was performed on the potential air emissions of PM<sub>10</sub> and PM<sub>2.5</sub> from the Goodman Energy Center project:

- A preliminary modeling analysis for PM<sub>10</sub> demonstrated that the proposed Goodman Energy Center project will not cause or significantly contribute to any violation of the 24-hour and annual PM<sub>10</sub> NAAQS. The modeled H1H impacts of 24-hour and annual PM<sub>10</sub> fall below the SIL thresholds. Therefore, refined (cumulative) modeling analyses are not required for this pollutant and averaging times.
- A detailed modeling analysis for PM<sub>2.5</sub> demonstrated the proposed Goodman Energy Center project will not cause or significantly contribute to any violation of the 24-hour or annual PM<sub>2.5</sub> NAAQS. It also demonstrated that 43.2 percent of the 24-hour PM<sub>2.5</sub> and 52.5 percent of the annual PM<sub>2.5</sub> Class II area maximum allowable increment are expected to be consumed by the proposed project.
- An analysis of visibility was conducted for Cedar Bluff State Park, Wilson State Park and Hays Regional Airport. The VISCREEN model results indicate no exceedances of the screening criteria at Cedar Bluff State Park and Wilson State Park. The analysis exceeds the Class I sky and terrain perceptibility threshold at Hays Regional Airport. Therefore, a second-level VISCREEN analysis was performed for the Hays Regional Airport. The visibility results of the second-level VISCREEN analysis for Hays Regional Airport show that the emissions from the project pass the Class I sky and terrain perceptibility thresholds. No adverse impacts on soils and vegetation in the area are expected.
- Any federal land manager who has reason to believe they may have a Class I area adversely impacted by the emissions from the proposed project has the opportunity to present KDHE with a demonstration of the adverse impact on the air quality-related values of the federal Class I area during the comment period.

A public comment period has been established until noon September 2 to allow citizens the opportunity to express any concerns they may have about this proposed permitting action. All comments should be submitted in writing to Gerald McIntyre, KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612-1366.

Any member of the public may request a public hearing be conducted to provide comments on the proposed issuance of the draft air quality construction permit. A written request to hold a public hearing should be sent to the attention of Gerald McIntyre at the address listed above or by fax to 785-291-3953 and must be received by noon September 2. If a pertinent request is received, a public hearing is tentatively scheduled by KDHE on Tuesday, September 9, at the Memorial Union, Black & Gold Room (room 212), Fort Hays State University, 600 Park St., Hays. The hearing will begin at 6 p.m. and continue until all audience members have had an opportunity to submit comments. If no pertinent requests to hold the public hearing are received by noon September 2, the public hearing will be cancelled. A notice of the cancellation will be posted at the KDHE website at <http://www.kdheks.gov/bar/publicnotice.html>.

If a hearing is conducted, all interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally or by submission of written materials during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to limit oral presentations to a specific time limit.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed materials in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation must be made not later than September 2 by contacting the Bureau of Air at 785-296-8548.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process for the PSD permit is available for public review for a period of 30 days from the date of publication during normal business hours, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., at the KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, and at the KDHE Northwest District Office, 2301 E. 13th St., Hays.
