The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is proposing to issue a five-year Phase II Acid Rain Permit to McPherson Municipal Power Plant #3 (Plant Code: 7515) pursuant to Title IV (Acid Deposition Control) of the Federal Clean Air Act and implementing regulations found in 40 CFR Parts 72 through 78. The effective date of the permit is from January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2019.

One (1) simple combustion turbine is affected by this permit action, identified as Unit No. 1, located at 1486 17th Ave., McPherson, KS 67460, Section 24, Township 19 South, Range 3 West, and operated by the McPherson Board of Public Utilities, P.O. Box 768, McPherson, KS 67460, and would receive 0 sulfur dioxide (SO₂) allowances for each year from 2015 through 2019. McPherson Municipal Power Plant #3 proposes to comply with the Acid Rain Program emission requirements by holding enough allowances to cover all sulfur dioxide emissions. Issuance of this permit would not affect the responsibility of McPherson Municipal Power Plant #3 to meet all other existing local, state and federal sulfur dioxide emission requirements.

The designated representative for McPherson Municipal Power Plant #3 is Alan D. Weinbrenner.

Temporary Administrative Regulations

Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

111-2-316. Cosentino’s Price Chopper grocery give-a-way. (a) The term of this promotion shall be from 12:00 a.m. October 1, 2014, through midnight on October 31, 2014.

(b) During the term of this promotion with participating chain numbers 1436 and 1732 Cosentino’s Price Chopper stores in Kansas, for every Super Kansas Cash single ticket purchase of \$3 or more, the player shall receive an entry for the “Grocery Give-A-Way” promotion drawing. Lottery terminals shall automatically dispense an entry form for each \$3 or more Super Kansas Cash single ticket purchase at participating Cosentino’s Price Chopper Kansas lottery retailers during the term of this promotion. The qualifying Super Kansas Cash purchase may be for a single draw or for multiple draws.

(c) During the term of this promotion, drop boxes for the deposit of entries shall be provided by the lottery and placed at all participating Cosentino’s Price Chopper locations. All drop boxes shall be retrieved by the Kansas lottery at the end of the promotion.

111-301-46. IN BETWEEN optional blackjack wager. (a) On or after August 1, 2014, Boot Hill Casino & Resort may offer an optional "IN BETWEEN" wager at any table offering the game of blackjack, as set forth in the rules herein.

(b) Except as otherwise set forth in the rules herein, all rules of the game of blackjack shall remain unaltered and any optional IN BETWEEN wager made shall not affect any other blackjack wager.

(c) Blackjack tables where the optional IN BETWEEN wager is available shall have a spot designated on the table game layout where the wager can be placed.

(d) A player may not place an IN BETWEEN wager unless the player has also placed at least the minimum blackjack wager required at that blackjack table.

(e) All IN BETWEEN wagers shall be made at the same time as that player's blackjack wager and shall be no less than the minimum, and no more than the maximum, wager stated at the blackjack table for IN BETWEEN.

(f) IN BETWEEN wagers apply only to the first two cards dealt to a player and the card that is dealt face up to the dealer.

(g) An IN BETWEEN wager shall win if the dealer's card that is dealt face up is of a rank falling between the rank of the player's first two cards, and shall lose if it does not, when using the following order of rank: 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, jack, queen, king, and ace, except that an IN BETWEEN wager shall also win if the player's first two cards and the dealer's card that is dealt face up are all of the same identical rank.

(h) Winning combinations and payout odds for IN BETWEEN wagers are as follows:

(1) Winning wagers with a "one card spread" shall be paid at the rate of ten (10) to one (1). A "one card spread" occurs when the dealer's card dealt face up is one rank higher than one of the player's initial two cards and one rank lower than the other of the player's first two cards

(by way of example only, the dealer's card dealt face up is an "8" and the player's initial two cards are a "7" and a "9");

(2) Winning wagers with a "two card spread" shall be paid at the rate of six (6) to one (1). A "two card spread" means when in order of rank there are two card ranks between the player's initial two cards, and the dealer's card dealt face up is equal to one of those two ranks (by way of example only, the dealer's card dealt face up is an "8" and the player's initial two cards are a "6" and a "9");

(3) Winning wagers with a "three card spread" shall be paid at the rate of four (4) to 1. A "three card spread" means when in order of rank there are three card ranks between the player's initial two cards, and the dealer's card dealt face up is equal to one of those three ranks (by way of example only, the dealer's card dealt face up is an "8" and the player's initial two cards are a "5" and a "9");

(4) Winning wagers with a "three of a kind" (also known as a "triple match") shall be paid at the rate of thirty (30) to one (1). A "three of a kind" occurs when the dealer's card dealt face up and the player's first two cards are of the same identical rank; and,

(5) All other winning IN BETWEEN wagers are paid at the rate of one (1) to one (1).

(i) All IN BETWEEN wagers shall be paid or taken and removed from the betting area immediately after the second of each player's and the dealer's two cards have been dealt and before the blackjack hand is played. All IN BETWEEN wagers shall be paid or taken in order of the players at the table from the dealer's right to left.

(j) Optional token wagers (dealer gratuities) may be placed on IN BETWEEN wagers, which if placed shall also be paid or taken at the same time as the player's IN BETWEEN wager is paid or taken.

(k) All blackjack insurance wagers, if any, will be paid or taken after the IN BETWEEN wager is paid or taken. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-8-7-14, July 16, 2014; amended, T-111-10-7-14, Sept. 10, 2014.)
