Electronic copies of the letting proposals and plans are available on the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) website at <https://kdotapp.ksdot.org/Proposal/Proposal.aspx>. The website will allow the contractor to request approval from KDOT to bid as a prime contractor and be included on the "Bid Holders List," or to be included on the "Non-Bid Holders List" as a subcontractor/supplier. KDOT's approval is required to bid as a prime contractor. Notice Concerning Proposed Air Quality Class I Operating Permit Renewal

Notice is hereby given that the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. HME, Inc. has applied for a Class I operating permit renewal in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et al. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards, and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping, and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

HME, Inc., 2828 NW Button Road, Topeka, KS 66618, owns and operates a structural steel fabrication facility located at 2828 NW Button Road, Topeka, KS 66618.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation, and all information relied upon during the permit application review process are available for public review during normal business hours, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., at the KDHE, Bureau of Air (BOA), 1000 SW Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, KS 66612-1366 and at the Northeast District Office (NEDO), 800 W. 24th St., Lawrence, KS 66046. To obtain or review the proposed permit and supporting documentation, contact James Stewart, 785-296-1104, at the KDHE central office or Pat Simpson, 785-842-4600, at the NEDO. The standard departmental cost will be assessed for any copies requested.

Written comments or questions regarding the proposed permit may be directed to James Stewart, KDHE, BOA, 1000 SW Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, KS 66612-1366. In order to be considered in formulating a final permit decision, written comments must be received no later than noon Monday, February 20, 2017.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to James Stewart, KDHE, BOA, no later than noon Monday, February 20, 2017, in order for the secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review

period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. At said time and place, and promptly thereafter, all bids that have been duly received will be publicly opened online at www.publicpurchase.com. Only bids submitted electronically at www.publicpurchase.com will be accepted.

The work consists of the following:

The project consists of the reconstruction of 143rd Street to a wide two-lane arterial from Pflumm Road to Quivira Road. The improvements will consist of reconstruction of 143rd Street to a 46' back of curb to back of curb (B-B) section with a 10' trail on the north side and a 5' sidewalk on the south side from the east curb returns of the Pflumm Road intersection to the west curb returns of the Quivira Road intersection. This does include mill and overlay of the existing divided 400' section just east of the Pflumm Road intersection and the existing divided 200' section west of the Quivira Road intersection. Also included is an eastbound right turn lane on 143rd Street at the Quivira Road intersection. Additional intersection improvements at Pflumm Road include widening 143rd Street from the west curb returns of the Pflumm Road intersection west approximately 500 feet to accommodate an additional eastbound left turn lane. Also included is widening Pflumm Road from the south curb returns of the intersection south approximately 500 feet to allow for an additional northbound through lane. Additional intersection improvements at Quivira Road include widening Quivira Road from the south curb returns of the intersection south approximately 750 feet to allow for an additional northbound through lane and an additional southbound receiving lane. This project will also include the installation of a traffic signal at 143rd Street and Pflumm Road, modifications to the signal at 143rd Street and Quivira

Road, new street lighting, and an enclosed storm sewer system. This is a joint project between the cities of Olathe and Overland Park. The city of Olathe will administer the project with cooperation, communication, and input from the city of Overland Park.

Bid documents including drawings and specifications are on file at the office of Public Works of Olathe, Kansas, and are open for public inspections. Bid documents and drawings may be downloaded free of charge from www.publicpurchase.com.

A satisfactory bid bond executed by the bidder or an acceptable surety, in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the total bid for work shall be submitted with each proposal. The original copy of the bid bond form must be submitted to the engineer within 48 hours of bid opening. Failure to submit original copy of the bid bond will result in rejection of bid and owner's selection of the next low qualified bidder.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish and pay satisfactory performance and payment bond or bonds.

Attention is called to the fact that not less than the minimum salaries and wages as set forth in the contract documents must be paid on this project, and that the contractor must ensure that employees and applicants for employment are not discriminated against because of their race, color, religion, sex, or national origin. Contractors must comply with Title 29 relating to the employment of apprentices in accordance with requirements published by the United States Department of Labor as contained in the contract documents.

Bidders are informed that the prime contractor and subcontractors are required to comply with Section 109 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Executive Order 11246, and Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968. Contractors responsibilities under these laws are outlined at Title 24, CFR Part 1 and Part 570 relating to non-discrimination in federally-assisted programs of the Department of Housing and Urban Development; Title 24, Part 130 relating to equal employment opportunity under HUD-assisted construction contract; and Title 24, Part 135 relating to employment opportunities for businesses and lower income persons in connection with assisted projects.

The prime general contractor, and subcontractors where appropriate, under the terms of the contract, shall be required to comply with the following requirements prior to issuance of a construction work order:

- (A) Maintain an affirmative action file detailing efforts to meet affirmative action hiring responsibilities and utilize minority firms as subcontractors and supplier;
- (B) Submit a copy of their affirmative action plan to the city for review and HUD concurrence;
- (C) Provide a preliminary statement of work force needs by category for the project and goals for minorities; and
- (D) Attend a scheduled pre-construction conference for orientation on HUD equal opportunity and labor standards requirements.

Article 3—GUIDELINES FOR THE DETERMINATION OF RESIDENCY FOR FEE PURPOSES

K.A.R. 88-3-8a The overall purposes for the proposed amendment to this regulation is to implement the provisions of 2016 House Bill 2567. This 2016 legislative action impacted the tuition rate available to and paid by veterans and their respective spouses or dependent children and was a companion piece of legislation to 2015 House Bill 2154. The board is proposing amendments to the existing regulation in order to provide for the residency status set forth in the more recent piece of legislation.

Article 24—GENERAL EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT TEST

K.A.R. 88-24-2 establishes the GED test score requirements for issuance of an equivalent high school diploma. The overall purpose for the proposed amendments to this regulation is to adopt the new passing scores.

Article 28 – PRIVATE AND OUT-OF-STATE POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS

These regulations are being amended to (1) change the definition of “enrollment agreement” to a broader meaning encompassing other types of enrollment documents; (2) establish a minimum time frame for record retention by institutions, to insure that specific types of important student related records are kept for a length of time that ensures their ongoing availability to the Board as well as program graduates and attendees, and amends the minimum refund policy requirement for institutions, which is dependent upon how long a student was in the program; (3) clarify that “functional equivalents” to catalogs and enrollment agreements may be provided to the Board, removes language referencing the no longer used ledger sheets, clarifies what financial information must be provided by institutions in their first year of operation, and generally clarifies other subsection language; (4) removes language specific to degree-granting institutions, clarifying that the Board of Regents may conduct on-site visits at any approved institution; (5) changes the registration of representative requirements from each individual representing an institution to require registration by a single designated representative of the institution, in order to limit the number of representatives submitted for approval and responsible for being the main institution contact; (6) clarify the definitions of in-state and out-of-state by replacing the word “domiciled” with “chartered, incorporated or otherwise organized under the laws of Kansas” and changes language in order to clarify that to be considered an in-state institution, the institution must be both physically located in Kansas and be established in Kansas; (7) increases the late fee to encourage compliance and

timely renewal application submission; and (8) revokes redundant language concerning fees for copies of student transcripts, which is also contained in another regulation.

Economic Impact:

88-3-8a There is no anticipated economic impact on the Board, as its duties to the universities will not significantly expand with the promulgation of this amendment to the regulation. The fiscal impact on the universities, community and technical colleges, and the impacted individuals will depend upon how many individuals will now qualify for resident tuition rates.

88-24-2 There will be no economic impact on the Board of Regents office or individuals taking the test. Some individuals who do not pass the test may be fiscally impacted if they have to pay to take it again.

88-28-1 through 88-28-8 The economic impact of these amendments to the Board of Regents office will be a negligible increase in revenues for the Private and Out-of-State Postsecondary Educational Institution program, due to an increase in the penalty paid by institutions filing late applications for renewal.
