The Consultant Shortlist Committee will select three to five of the most highly qualified firms expressing interest and schedule an individual interview. The consulting firms can more thoroughly discuss their experience related to the project at the interview and will be expected to discuss their approach to this project in detail and the personnel to be assigned to this project. Firms not selected to be short-listed will be notified.

1. Professional qualifications.
2. Experience of staff assigned to the project.
3. Firm’s experience with similar projects.
4. Firm’s performance record.

The committee will rate and select one firm to perform the professional services required for completing the advertised project. Summary

Pursuant to section 102(2)(c) of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969; the Council on Environmental Quality Regulations (40 Code of Federal Regulations [CFR] Part 1500); and the Natural Resources Conservation Service Regulations (7 CFR Part 650); the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), gives notice that an environmental impact statement is not being prepared for Muddy Creek Watershed, Butler County, Kansas.

Supplementary information

The environmental assessment of this federally assisted action indicates that the project will not cause significant local, regional, or national impact on the environment. As a result of these findings, Karen A. Woodrich, State Conservationist, has determined that the preparation and review of an environmental impact statement is not needed for this project.

The project's purpose is to meet current state and NRCS hazard class dam criteria so the structure will continue to provide flood damage reduction benefits. The planned work of improvement includes the rehabilitation of Muddy Creek Watershed Floodwater Retarding Dam 4-6, located in Butler County, Kansas.

The Notice of Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) has been forwarded to the Environmental Protection Agency and to various federal, state, and local agencies and interested parties. Notice of Proposed Constitutional Amendment

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 1605

A PROPOSITION to amend section 1 of article 10 of the constitution of the state of Kansas; relating to reapportionment of senatorial and representative districts.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Kansas, two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the Senate and two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House of Representatives concurring therein:

Section 1. The following proposition to amend the constitution of the state of Kansas shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the state for their approval or rejection: Section 1 of article 10 of the constitution of the state of Kansas is hereby amended to read as follows:

“§ 1. Reapportionment of senatorial and representative districts. (a) ~~At its regular session in 1989, the legislature shall by law reapportion the state representative districts, the state senatorial districts or both the state representative and senatorial districts upon the basis of the latest census of the inhabitants of the state taken by authority of chapter 61 of the 1987 Session Laws of Kansas. At its regular session in 1992, and at its regular session every tenth year thereafter, the legislature shall by law reapportion the state senatorial districts and representative districts on the basis of the population of the state as established by the most recent census of population taken and published by the United States census bureau of the census. Senatorial and representative districts shall be reapportioned upon the basis of the population of the state adjusted: (1) To exclude nonresident military personnel stationed within the state and nonresident students attending colleges and universities within the state; and (2) to include military personnel stationed within the state who are residents of the state and students attending colleges and universities within the state who are residents of the state in the district of their permanent residence.~~ Bills reapportioning legislative districts shall be published in the Kansas register immediately upon final passage and shall be effective for the next following election of legislators and thereafter until again reapportioned.

(b) Within 15 days after the publication of an act reapportioning the legislative districts within the time specified in (a), the attorney general shall petition the supreme court of the state to determine the validity thereof. The supreme court, within 30 days from the filing of the petition, shall enter its judgment. Should the supreme court determine that the reapportionment statute is invalid, the legislature shall enact a statute of reapportionment conforming to the judgment of the supreme court within 15 days.

(c) Upon enactment of a reapportionment to conform with a judgment under (b), the attorney general shall apply to the supreme court of the state to determine the validity thereof. The supreme court, within 10 days from the filing of such application, shall enter its judgment. Should the supreme court determine that the reapportionment statute is invalid, the legislature shall again enact a statute reapportioning the legislative districts in compliance with the direction of and conforming to the mandate of the supreme court within 15 days after entry thereof.

(d) Whenever a petition or application is filed under this section, the supreme court, in accordance with its rules, shall permit interested persons to present their views.

(e) A judgment of the supreme court of the state determining a reapportionment to be valid shall be final until the legislative districts are again reapportioned in accordance herewith.”

Sec. 2. The following statement shall be printed on the ballot with the amendment as a whole:

“Explanatory statement. The purpose of this amendment is to eliminate the adjustment of census taken by the United States census bureau regarding nonresident military personnel and nonresident students when reapportioning the Kansas senate and house of representatives.

“A vote for this proposition would eliminate the adjustment of census taken by the United States census bureau regarding nonresident military personnel and nonresident students when reapportioning the Kansas senate and house of representatives.

“A vote against this proposition would continue in effect the requirement for the adjustment of census taken by the United States census bureau regarding nonresident military personnel and nonresident students when reapportioning the Kansas senate and house of representatives.”

Sec. 3. This resolution, if approved by two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the Senate, and two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House of Representatives shall be entered on the journals, together with the yeas and nays. The secretary of state shall cause this resolution to be published as provided by law and shall cause the proposed amendment to be submitted to the electors of the state at the general election in November in the year 2019, unless a special election is called at a sooner date by concurrent resolution of the legislature, in which case it shall be submitted to the electors of the state at the special election.

K.A.R. 105-5-2, K.A.R. 105-5-3, K.A.R. 105-5-6, K.A.R. 105-5-7, K.A.R. 105-5-8 establish the hourly rate to be paid to the private attorneys who accept court appointments to defend indigent persons in the absence of a public defender. The rate to be paid to assigned counsel is increased from \$75 per hour to \$80 per hour and each of the “caps” for the severity level of the charge is similarly increased from the “cap” at \$75 per hour to the “cap” at \$80 per hour. These amendments reflect the rate set by statute of \$80 per hour.

Economic Impact.

The Board anticipates that the statutory assigned counsel hourly rate of \$80/hour will cost an additional \$1,500,000 to the state general fund.

(e) The dealer shall then offer the cut card to a player at the table to place in the decks of cards.

(f) The dealer shall then place a second cut card 14 cards from the end of the decks of cards and the cards shall then be placed into the shoe.

(g) The dealer will then draw the first card out of the shoe, turn it face up on the table, and continue to draw from the shoe, the number of cards equal to the point value of the first card. All cards drawn are discarded. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implement-

ing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-9-12, Dec. 14, 2011; amended, T-111-10-11-19, Aug. 21, 2019.)
